- Before obedience, submission
 - · Defer to authority as the one who bears responsibility and who is wiser
 - Be a student: Learn from parents as teachers (Deut 6:6-7; Prov 1:8, 10; 2:1; 3:1)
 - Listen with respect (Prov 23:22)
- Children either obey or disobey (Eph 6:1; Col 3:20)
- Obedience is not absolute or blind (Jesus in Lk 2; 1 Tim 5:1). Human authorities have limited authority.
